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SUNDAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

Epistle: 2 Corinthians 6:1-10

Working together with him, then, we entreat you not to accept the grace of God in vain. ² For he says,

"At the acceptable time I have listened to you. and helped you on the day of salvation."

Behold, now is the acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³ We put no obstacle in any one's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, 5 beatings, imprisonments, tumults, labors, watching, hunger; ⁶ by purity, knowledge, forbearance, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love, ⁷ truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; 8 in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; 9 as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold we live; as punished, and yet not killed; 10 as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

The Parable of the Talents

¹⁴ "For it will be as when a man going on a journey called his servants and entrusted to them his property; 15 to one he gave five talents, [a] to another two, to another one, to each according to his ability. Then he went away. 16 He who had received the five talents went at once and traded with them; and he made five talents more. ¹⁷ So also, he who had the two talents made two

talents more. 18 But he who had received the one talent went and dug in the ground and hid his master's money. 19 Now after a long time the master of those servants came and settled accounts with them. 20 And he who had received the five talents came forward, bringing five talents more, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me five talents; here I have made five talents more.' ²¹ His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master. 22 And he also who had the two talents came forward, saying, 'Master, you delivered to me two talents; here I have made two talents more.' 23 His master said to him, 'Well done, good and faithful servant; you have been faithful over a little, I will set you over much; enter into the joy of your master." ²⁴ He also who had received the one talent came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not winnow; 25 so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' 26 But his master answered him, 'You wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I have not sowed, and gather where I have not winnowed? 27 Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and at my coming I should have received what was my own with interest. 28 So take the talent from him, and give it to him who has the ten talents. ²⁹ For to every one who has will more be given, and he will have abundance; but from him who has not, even what he has will be taken away. 30 And cast the worthless servant into the outer darkness; there men will weep and gnash their teeth.'

Blessed John the Merciful of Rostov (also known as "Vlasatyi" - "the Hairy") Commemorated on September 16 / 3

Blessed John the Merciful of Rostov (also known as "Vlasatyi" - "the Hairy") asceticised at Rostov in the exploit of holy folly (iurodstvo), in it enduring deprivation and sorrow. He did not have a permanent shelter and at times took his rest at the house of his spiritual father - a priest at the church of the All-Holy ("Veskhsvyatsk"), or with one of the aged widows. Living in humility, patience unceasing prayer, he spiritually nourished many a person, in which number was also the Monk Irinarkh, Hermit of Rostov (Comm. January). After his lengthy life of pursuing asceticism he died on 3 September 1580 and was buried, according to his final wishes, alongside the church of Saint Blaise beyond the altar.

He had "hair upon his head abundantly", wherefore he was called "Vlasatyi" or "Hairy". The title "Merciful" was bestown upon Blessed John for the many healings that occurred at his grave, and also in connection with the memory of the holy Patriarch John the Merciful (VII Century, Comm. 12 November), whose name he had in common.

Mystery of Confession - Opportunities are available after every service, most Saturdays during fasting periods from 11am to 1pm, OR by appointment.

Holy Communion/Eucharist - The reception of the Holy Eucharist is encouraged by all Orthodox Christians who have properly prepared themselves, with fasting from midnight on, regular Confession, and forgiveness for all people. Those who are not Orthodox may receive a blessing from the chalice.

<u>Lapsed Members</u> – You are always welcome home and we want you back! Generally speaking, sincere participation in the Mysteries of Confession, Communion, and regular attendance at the divine services are all that is required to begin parish life anew! See Fr. Dave for specific details.

Baptisms - Please consult Father for details.

Adult Chrismation - New parishioners are always welcome! In the case of adults seeking entrance into the Church, a period of prescribed catechism will be established with Fr. Dave before administration of the Mysteries. An Orthodox

Christian sponsor is also required.

Marriages - Are not performed during fasting periods and certain Feast Days. Please consult Father ASAP for details (*before* arrangements are made for the hall). <u>Church Funerals</u> – are provided for practicing Orthodox Christians who are current in their spiritual and financial obligations; otherwise burial is from the funeral home. The Church does not permit cremation. +++ +++ +++

DEVOTIONAL PRAYER OF THE WEEK:

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Amvon Prayer from the Nativity of the Theotokos

Lord Christ our God, Thou art without beginning and surpass all essence. Thou see and rule all. Thou art a God Who work wonders and make the unexpected come to pass. Alone Thou accomplish great deeds. Lord, Who hear our petitions, Thou art the Savior of those in despair and confusion. Thou reward good desires arising from prayer. For Thy servants Joachim and Anna, who lived blamelessly together, Thou changed the sorrow of barrenness to the joy of children.

Thou gave them a beautiful offspring, a shoot growing from the root of Jesse mystically foretold by lips inspired by God. From this shoot Thou planned that the flower guiding the world aright would be born according to the flesh. Now Thou, a fountain of all goodness and enlightenment and giver of riches have sprung up. Born of a Virgin, Thou filled the community with grace and showed forth the birth of salvation.

As we partake of Thy divine Mysteries and deifying Liturgy, deliver us from a sterile barrenness in good works and deem us worthy to make virtues our offering to Thee always, that we may have a right to a place in the land of the just in Thy kingdom.
